The Clarendon Aristotle Series is designed for both students and professionals. It offers accurate translations of chosen Aristotelian texts, accompanied by incisive commentaries that concentrate on philosophical issues and problems. There are several objective difficulties to make sense of Iota as a part of the Metaphysics and as a bit of Aristotelian philosophy. The English translation, based on Ross' vital edition, is meant as an instrument for readers with or without understanding of ancient greek language. Castelli presents a new translation and comprehensive commentary of the tenth book (Iota) of Aristotle's Metaphysics, which gives Aristotle's most systematic account of what it is for something to be one, what it really is for something to become a device of measurement, what contraries are, and what the function of contraries is definitely in shaping the structure of truth into genera and species. Important fresh titles are being put into the series, and numerous well-established volumes are being reissued with revisions and/or supplementary materials. Castelli's Intro tackles such general problems, while the commentary provides a detailed evaluation of the arguments, of the more specific issues and of the philosophical factors emerging from Aristotle's text.Laura M.
