

The book is immensely good for the readers to get a clear knowledge of various CBFM practices prevailing in Bangladesh. The various other main weakness may be the lack of defeat level authority to coordinate with community to make the process vibrant. Providing a comprehensive and critical analysis of success stories regarding several CBFM practices in different forest areas of Bangladesh, as well as their particular strengths and weaknesses, it identifies posting authority to take decision simply by the community among the primary weaknesses. The reserve determines that it is the city patrol group which is usually most effective under the comanagement system, yet the general body and executive committee of the co-management system are composed of different stakeholders, each which is subject to their own work pressures, and are much less effective as claimed. There is a need to empower communities living in and around forests, and to create ownership of the forests in order to believe that the forests around them are by the community and for the city.
