When I was created in the early seventies, existence expectancy for those with CF was in the teenagers. Cystic fibrosis affects seventy thousand people world-wide. Andy writes about how he has handled depression for most of his life and the negative effects it has already established on his family members and loved ones. This is actually the tale of a competitive person with a life-threatening disease-the tale of a person with hopes and dreams, just like everyone else, who must also deal with extraordinary situations.
