The Psychopath Check is a remarkable journey through the minds of madness. Jon Ronson's exploration of a potential hoax being played on the world's top neurologists requires him, unexpectedly, in to the center of the madness sector. a legendary CEO whose psychopathy offers been speculated about in the press; and an individual in an asylum for the criminally insane who insists he's sane and certainly not a psychopath.
