

Quest Program I: Social Skills Curriculum for Elementary School Students with Autism



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The QUEST Program I was developed to address the needs of elementary students with social skills and pragmatic vocabulary weaknesses. Because these children reap the benefits of regular instruction and practice, the program uses a rigorous proactive approach to teach social skills by combining created instruction with video games, experiential stories, and role play, which results in discussion, friendly feedback from peers, and real-world experience. The goals of this program are to greatly help students gain an improved understanding of human being behavior and interaction, and to provide opportunities to be familiar and comfortable with the public skills and pragmatic vocabulary necessary to achieve success at school and locally. Even when given an inclusive education in an over-all education setting, these learners usually do not typically interpret cultural cues, nuances and guidelines of interaction just as as their peers, which is the reason the program maximizes generalization of abilities both in and outside the classroom.



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
