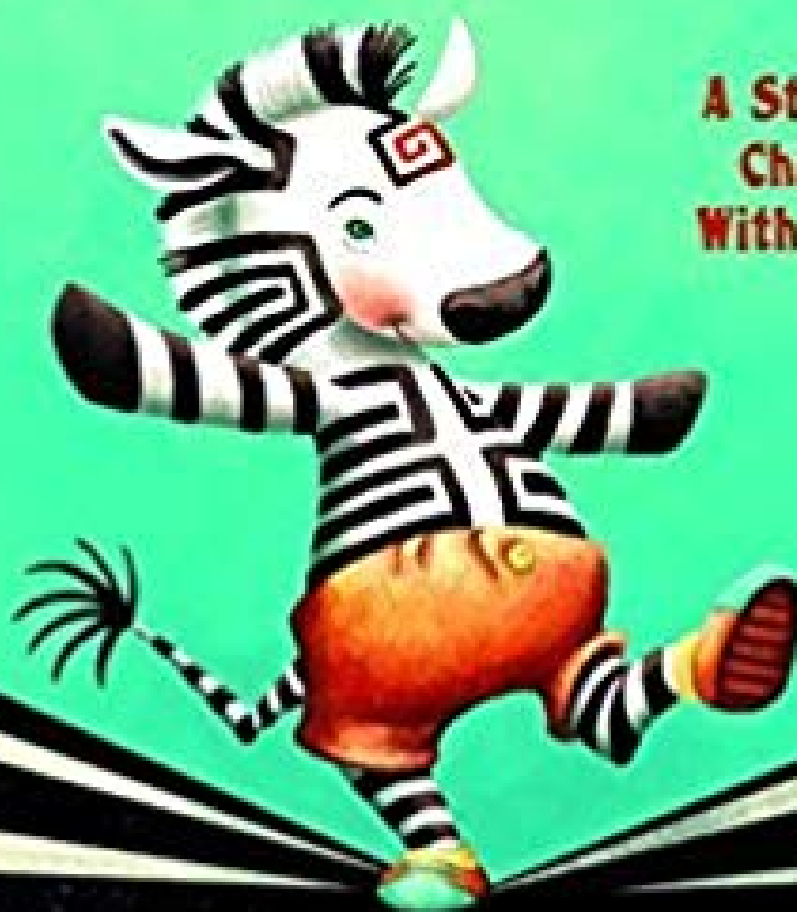


All My Stripes

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A noisy lunchroom, music course, afternoon announcements over a loudspeaker, etc. April is Autism Awareness month. It explains that he was so scared when he noticed the alarm that he hid under his table and screamed WHILE THE CLASS Still left HIM!!! He was scared until he was FOUND by the firefighters!! It also plants the idea that the kid could be left behind by teachers and classmates!! I feel there would be much more effective examples to use that could not instill extra fears in a child, especially in an currently anxiety-producing event like a fire drill. This is a disappointing example and I'd Not read that section of the book to my child as it teaches children THE ABSOLUTE This book tries to provide a significant message about differences, and is filled with helpful information as well.. I visited Piper Lu and purchased a zebra Autism shirt (100% goes to Autism consciousness) and read the book to each class. Wish I possibly could give negative stars! Do NOT buy! would have helped to illustrate the same concept without the added drama to be left behind in an crisis. This was one of the first books we attempted for our autistic child and we had been disgusted. Essentially, little zebra experienced autism and sensory issues. During the school day the fire alarm will go off and terrified him.. I believe it would be a great book to talk about with students since it encourages them to check out all the different parts of the person and not just their "autism stripe".so his teacher ABANDONS him in his frightened state, alone in the class! It could be applied to all sorts of differences between kids. And this is supposed to be considered a positive reserve for children on the spectrum! Do NOT buy! Special little Zebra It is very difficult to find mugs or key chains with my Grandson's name, Zane, printed on them. When I noticed the book "All My Stripes" and saw the cute small drawing on the cover, I considered about "Zane the Zebra". After that, as I looked past the picture and saw the little zebra offers autism, I truly cried. This reserve was great to make use of to explain to my kindergarten/1st grade college students what autism is normally and why we shouldn't deal with someone differently because of it. What a comforting little story for our entire family members to learn to help us on this new trip we share jointly.! The additional advice are helpful. Thank you, Shaina and Danielle. I really do love this book I really do love this reserve. My son doesn't quite recognize that he offers autism yet. My autistic grandson liked the colorful book and paid attention to what as I examine to him. I wish that the reserve used humans. They LOVED it! There are numerous story books about children with autism however, not plenty of books for children who actually have autism. But most likely one of the best autism books I've read. Utilized this book for an Autism Consciousness Month library storytime ... Used this book for an Autism Recognition Month library storytime for typically-developing children (early elementary) and it had been a big strike. We also did a coloring activity (zebra) whilst having thoughtful discussions around kindness and building social-emotional skills. This will become my go-to "autism" publication for neurotypical children and the ones on the spectrum. I came across the reason of autism in this book to become a bit too abstract, but, my autistic child who loves zebras also appreciated this book. He might relate more if it had been a boy like him. I'm a special education teacher at an elementary school.. The abstract for an audio child is hard. That is a disappointing example and I would Not read that part of the reserve to my child since it teaches kids THE ABSOLUTE WORST MOVE TO MAKE in an emergency! It is a satisfying little tale everyone will find useful and encouraging. I've had so many kids identify with Zane. That is a must add to your book collection if you're a teacher or use small kids.



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
